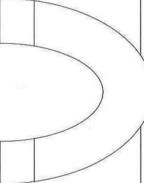

## Q-LINK

GOAL Enhancing energy, improving life.

METHOD Billing itself as a personal energy system, the Q-Link Pendant—developed by Larkspurbased wellness company Clarus Transphase Scientific—uses Sympathetic Resonance Technology to resonate so-called life-supporting frequencies and balance the body's energy field.

As far as those "killer genes," Dr. Gundry's studies turned up some scary findings. In any ecosystem, there is only so much food to go around, thus humans are possessed of an innate calorie counter. "People who take in more than their fair share are a threat to everybody else. If we're exceeding that number of allotted calories, our genes say, 'Bye-bye, that's all you get." When these "killer genes" are activated, health issues begin in the form of high cholesterol and diabetes. "All of these are ways designed to slow us down and stop us in our tracks," he says.

Grains, quickly converted to sugar in the bloodstream, are also a culprit. Citing the turn-of-the-century inventions of cereal and refined grains, Dr. Gundry observes, "When ground-up grain products are introduced into a culture that has never seen them before, within 20 years, all the diseases of Western Civilization begin appearing."

Gundry's solutions for taking back your health are remarkably simple: a quarter-cup of raw nuts twice daily, halving the intake (or eliminating altogether) of artificial sweeteners, limiting dairy consumption and a glass or two of red wine daily.

Rather than mask health problems with medicinal quick fixes, Dr. Gundry advocates going back to basics to create solutions. "Diabetes and high blood pressure are the warning light on our internal car dashboard. You don't put a piece of tape over the light; you have it serviced. We've been misled to think that health is something that comes in a pill bottle, but if you give your genes what they're looking for, they'll take care of you."
